UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following O R D E R

- The application for permission to file the Special Leave Petition is allowed.
- 2. Delay condoned.
- 3. We have heard learned Senior Counsel for the petitioner, who claims to be the next friend of respondent No.4 the alleged detenue.
- 4. We find from the averments that the Entry Visa of respondent No.4 the alleged detenue, who is a Nigerian National and had come to India on 04.09.2015, had expired on 09.09.2015. The alleged detenue had surrendered his passport to the custody of the City Civil and Sessions Court, Greater Bombay, in the pending

criminal proceedings. It further seems that while he was already in custody in Bangalore, the Central Crime Branch arrested him in another case pertaining to the sale of illicit drugs. Eventually, the chargesheet was filed and the Sessions Court had taken cognizance of the charges against the detenue on 03.02.2025. Thereafter, respondent No.4 – the alleged detenue filed a Criminal Petition before the High Court seeking quashing of his arrest on various grounds, which has been dismissed vide the impugned judgment dated 27.03.2025.

- 5. The petitioner has filed the instant Special Leave Petitions claiming to be the next friend of respondent No.4 the alleged detenue and further alleging that no sooner was the Habeas Corpus Petition dismissed, the detenue was detained by the Foreigners Restriction Centre.
- 6. While we decline to entertain these Special Petitions on behalf of the petitioner, we request the Executive Chairman of the Karnataka State Legal Services Authority to immediately depute a legal-aid counsel, who will contact the Foreigners Restriction Centre and, thereafter, shall establish contact with respondent No.4 - the alleged detenue. The State Legal Services Authority shall provide free legal-aid to respondent No.4 - the alleged detenue to enable him to execute the necessary documents for filing Special Leave Petition before this Court. The State Legal Services Authority shall immediately forward those documents to the Secretary of the Supreme Court Legal Services Committee. The Secretary of the said Committee, after getting necessary approval, shall appoint some Senior Advocate, preferably having expertise in the field, to pursue the Special Leave Petition that may be filed by respondent No.4/alleged detenue.
- 7. With these directions, these Special Leave Petitions stand disposed of.
- 8. As a result, the pending interlocutory application also stands disposed of.
