Petitioners have filed this petition under Article 226 of Constitution of India making a prayer that petitioners be permitted provisionally to fill in the form in Examination of Data Entry Operator.

Counsel appearing for petitioners submitted that petitioners are not having CPCT clearance certificate. It is submitted that said certificate is mandatory for filling up the form. Counsel further submitted that as per the Rules CPCT examination is not mandatory. Educational qualification which is prescribed for post of Computer Operator by the Department is applicable in case of petitioners. Said Rules prescribed 10+2 education system, "A" Level Diploma from D.O.E.A.C.C./I.E.T.E. or P.G.D.C.A./B.C.A. with Computer Science Subject from affiliated Institution or in addition to a three years Diploma in Computer/Information Technology. On strength of aforesaid Rules it is submitted that since there is no mandatory requirement for qualifying CPCT therefore, petitioners be permitted provisionally.

On payment of process fee within seven working days, notice be issued to respondents. Notice be made returnable within four weeks.

List the case in week commencing 27/04/2026.

Petitioners may be permitted to fill up the form for sitting in examination of Data Entry Operator.
