1. Petitioners who claim themselves to be vigilant citizens and public spirited persons have filed the instant writ petition to protect the public interest seeking following relief:

“It is, therefore, most humbly prayed that this writ petition in the form of PIL (AS MISUSE OF PUBLIC MONEY) may kindly be allowed with cost and by an appropriate writ, order or direction:-

(i) The Tender procedure and work order issued in favour of Respondent no. 8 may kindly be declared and the same may kindly be quashed and set aside.

(ii) The Respondents authority may kindly be directed to look into the matter and after it tender procedure as per law may be adopted in the interest of public at large; and

(iii) The respondents authorities as well as higher authority of Rajasthan Government ie. Lokayukt or Secretary to the Government of Rajasthan may kindly be directed to initiate an independent vigilance/ACB inquiry into all contracts awarded to M/s AK Logistics Private Limited, M/s Renga Engineering Works India Private Limited, and M/s Loknath Construction Private Limited (informally handled by M/s AK Logistics Private Limited) in RVUNL plants.

(iv) The Respondents may kindly all be directed to investigate the role of high-ranking officials in preparing restrictive PQRs and repeatedly awarding inflated contracts and stay/suspend the ongoing tender processes in favor of the Respondent no.8 until the investigation is complete.

(v) The respondent may kindly be directed to take appropriate. action against all officials and private parties for their guilty of corruption or collusion.

(vi) This matter is related to serious financial irregularities, suspicious corruption, and loss to the government exchequer; therefore, immediate intervention from this Hon'ble Court is required;

(vii) Any other appropriate relief which deemed fit in the facts and circumstances of the case may kindly be passed in favour of the petitioner.”





2. Heard the learned counsel for the petitioners, and on perusal of the contents of the petition, coupled with the fact that various writ petitions, viz. Civil Writ Petition Nos. 23459/2025, 23413/2025, 23415/2025, 23437/2025, 23444/2025, 23507/2025, 23512/2025, 23556/2025, 23464/2025, 23440/2025, 9028/2026, 8897/2026, 8797/2026, 9377/2026, 8889/2026, and 8817/2026, are already sub judice before this Court, wherein the work order issued in favour of respondent No. 8 is under challenge at the instance of various competitors, it appears to us that the present writ petition, though projected as one in public interest, is nothing but a collateral attempt to settle personal scores.

3. The petitioners appear to have been planted by the competitors. However, we refrain from making any further observations in this regard. Suffice to say that we are not inclined to interfere in the present public interest litigation

4. Taking a wholesome view, the present writ petition is found to be devoid of any merit and is accordingly dismissed.

5. All pending applications stand disposed of.
