I.A. 12484/2026 (Additional Documents)

1. The present application has been filed on behalf of the plaintiff under Order XI Rule 1(4) of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as 'CPC') as applicable to commercial suits under the Commercial Courts Act, 2015 (hereinafter referred to as 'CC Act') seeking leave to place on record additional documents.

2. The plaintiff is permitted to file additional documents in accordance with the provisions of the CC Act and the Delhi High Court (Original Side) Rules, 2018.

3. Accordingly, the application stands disposed of.

I.A. 12483/2026 (Pre-litigation mediation)

4. This is an application filed by the plaintiff seeking exemption from instituting pre-litigation Mediation under Section 12A of the CC Act.

5. As the present matter contemplates urgent interim relief, in light of the judgment of the Supreme Court in *Yamini Manohar vs. T.K.D. Keerthi: (2024) 5 SCC 815*, exemption from the requirement of pre-institution Mediation is granted.

6. The application stands disposed of.

I.A. 12485/2026 (Exemption from filing clear copies of documents)

7. This is an application filed on behalf of the plaintiffs under Section 151 of CPC seeking exemption from filing clear copies of documents along with the captioned suit.

8. Exemption allowed, subject to just exceptions. However, true translated/clear copies of the said documents in the application, with proper margins be filed within two weeks with an advance copy to the defendants.

9. The application stands disposed of.

I.A. 12486/2026 (Extension of time to file Hash Report U/s 63(4) (C) BSA

10. This is an application under Section 151 of CPC seeking extension of time for filing Hash Report under Section 63(4)(C) of the Bhartiya Sakshya Adhiniyam, 2023.

11. For the reasons stated therein, the same is allowed. Plaintiff is permitted to file the said report within 60 days with an advance copy to learned counsel for the defendants.

12. The application stands disposed of.

I.A. 12487/2026 (Seeking transfer of CS(COMM) 84/2026 from Rohini Court to this Court

13. This is an application under Section 24 of CPC read with Rule 26 of the Delhi High Court Intellectual Property Rights Division Rules, 2022, filed on behalf of plaintiff, seeking transfer of CS(COMM) 84/2026 titled "*Shivang*



Edibles Oils Limited v. K.S. Oils Limited & Anr.”, pending before the learned District Judge (Commercial Court-02), Rohini, to this Court for trial and disposal in order to avoid multiplicity of proceedings and conflicting findings.

14. Issue notice.

15. Notice is accepted by Mr. Neeraj Grover, learned counsel appearing for the defendant nos.1 to 3, who seeks and is granted four weeks’ time to file reply to the application.

16. Rejoinder, thereto, if any, be filed within two weeks thereafter.

I.A. 12482/2026 (Stay)

17. Present application has been filed on behalf of the plaintiff under Order XXXIX Rules 1 & 2 of CPC, 1908, seeking *ex-parte ad-interim* injunction against the defendants.

18. Issue notice.

19. Notice is accepted by Mr. Neeraj Grover, learned counsel appearing for the defendant nos.1 to 3.

20. After extensive arguments, Mr. Neeraj Grover, learned counsel appearing for the defendant nos.1 to 3, on instructions, states without prejudice to his rights and contentions in respect of the allegations made in the plaint, that since January, 2026 the defendants have stopped using the “DOUBLE SHER” word mark.

21. The defendants shall file an affidavit to the aforesaid extent within one week.

22. Reply, if any, be filed within three weeks with an advance copy to learned counsel for the plaintiff. Two weeks’ time is granted to the plaintiff to file rejoinder affidavit.

CS(COMM) 472/2026

23. Let the plaint be registered as a suit.

24. Issue summons to the defendants.



25. Mr. Neeraj Grover, learned counsel for the defendant nos.1 to 3 accepts summons and waives issuance of the formal summons to the defendants.

26. Written Statement shall be filed by the defendants within 30 days from date. Alongwith the Written Statement, the defendants shall also file an affidavit of Admission/Denial of the documents of the plaintiff, without which the Written Statement shall not be taken on record.

27. Liberty is granted to the plaintiff to file Replication, if any, within 30 days from the receipt of the Written Statement. Along with the Replication filed by the plaintiff, an affidavit of Admission/Denial of the documents of defendant be filed by the plaintiff, without which the Replication shall not be taken on record.

28. In case any party is placing reliance on a document, which is not in their power and possession, its details and source shall be mentioned in the list of reliance, which shall also be filed with the pleadings.

29. If any of the parties wish to seek inspection of any documents, the same shall be sought and given within the prescribed timelines.

30. List before the Joint Registrar (Judicial) on 04.08.2026 for completion of pleadings.

31. List before the Court on 21.07.2026.
